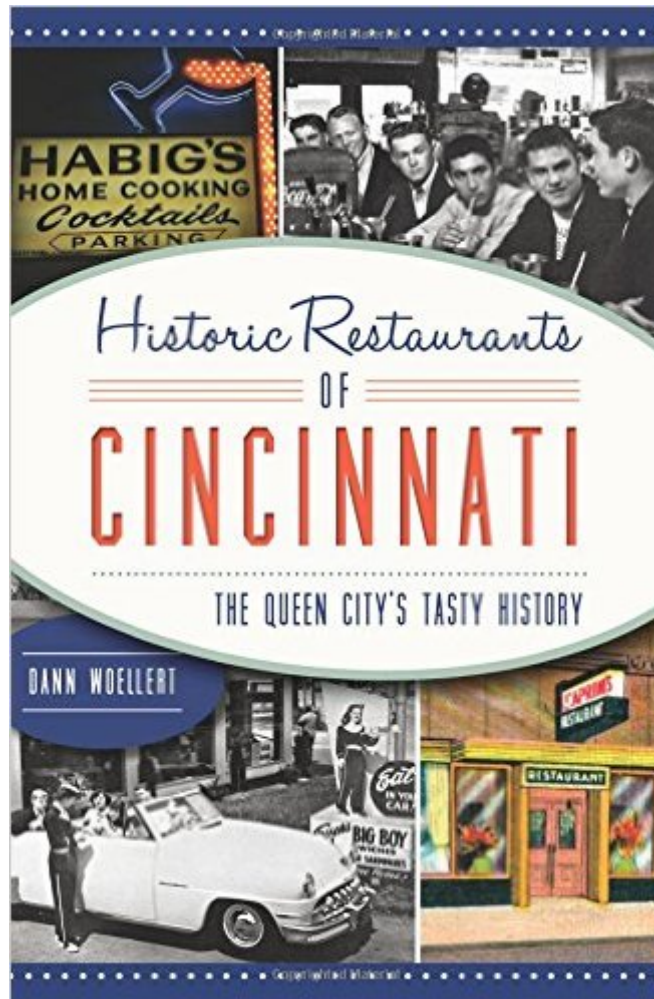

This book contains some pretty interesting anecdotes. The problem is "can I believe them? Unfortunately, the book contains many errors and misstatements. Maybe the most glaring is the repeated misspelling of the Izzy Kadetz™ family's surname as "œCadets". Ugh.
